## Fall Renovation - Killing Out Your Lawn



### Toby's 2018 Total Lawn Renovation



*Is your lawn full of weeds, diseases or you just hate the grass you have? Toby's Total Lawn Renovation lets you start over. In just a matter of weeks you'll kill out your old ugly lawn and be on the way to a beautiful new lawn. Follow these steps carefully.*

1

August 1 – Sept. 1: Apply 1st application of grass & weed killer. Use either Ace Grass & Weed Killer or Gordons Pronto Weed & Grass Killer. After applying weed & grass killer check 7-10 days later and spot spray any green still showing. Be sure that all weeds and grass have completely died out and spot spray any areas that continue to pop up. Be sure to look for any small weeds and spray those as well.



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## Fall Renovation - Killing Out Your Lawn

### 2018 Total Lawn Renovation - Page 2

*Once your lawn is completely dead you will want to follow these steps to prepare for and apply seed.*

**2** Mow short: 1 ½ inches and be sure to bag clippings

**3** Verti-cut two directions: North-South then East-West.

**4** Rake: Remove the debris that the verti-cut brings up.

**5** Re-mow to make sure the lawn is completely clean.

- 6** Seed: Hummert Dyna Green Fescue-Blue for Sun – 6 to 8 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. or Hummert Best of Blues – 2 to 3 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft.
- 7** Apply Hummert Fall Lawn Starter Fertilizer
- 8** Water! Water! Water!
- 9** Apply Mushroom Stuff once grass seed has germinated and is 1-2" in height

*Until seed germinates evenly, water lightly every day. On hot windy days you might have to water 2 to 3 times to keep the soil moist. On cool calm cloudy days watering may be needed only once a day or once every other day. The soil should be kept evenly moist at all times but not waterlogged. After the new grass reaches 2 inches in height gradually reduce the frequency of watering and water more deeply. Start mowing after the new grass reaches a height of 3 inches. Once the new lawn has been mowed 2 to 3 times, it will need 1 inch of water a week either from rainfall or watering until the soil freezes.*
